## AGENDA/MINUTES

1. Approval of Minutes-Motion by Ashley, second by Sarah – Motion approved.
2. Updated Contact Information Sheet for SCC Members
3. School Community Council Training-several attended the September session, others are going today.
4. School Community Council Outreach
  - External Communication
    - PTA Newsletter – Monthly Article (Sarah) – Can SCC take a position on the Land Trust Ballot Initiative to be voted on?
  - Website Information
    - Rules of Order
    - Final Report (prior year implementation)-Our funds hired three literacy aides, and math aide, and may be used to purchase science equipment. Refer to the SCC website
5. CSIP & School Land Trust Plan (Goals and Expenditures) – Our current budget is \$40,431. The aides are just beginning groups for this year now as initial testing is completed.
  - Review Plan/Implementation- Our CSIP plan can be amended if more funds become available.
  - Evaluate Data-The literacy testing has changed from the CBM to the SRI and DIBELS. The MCOMP and MCAP tests are more rigorous as is the Envision curriculum.
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6. Cell Tower Funds - \$2,000 - \$2,500 per year previously, we carried over some funds to this year so this year we have about \$5,000 that we can use. A motion was made by Rene, seconded by Pepper, and motion passed to earmark these funds for more student incentives, teacher incentives (luncheons etc.), a chromebook lab, and/or teacher professional development fees.
7. Safe Technology and Digital Citizenship – Faculty member, Nic Heinz, reported that digital citizenship instruction is being implemented during the morning announcements by the student council and that a NetSmart assembly will be considered.
8. Safe Routes/Student Access East Side of School – Quail Hollow Drive by Albion is a city street. Crosswalks are provided at the corners and cannot be put in the middle of the block. Consider signs that don't allow drop-off or pick-up of students on the Albion side of the street. We may need to close off the back stairway to discourage stops in this area.
9. Bell Efficiency Schedule – This is a district proposal to maximize bus efficiency. Other schools are affected much more than Quail Hollow would be. No position was taken on this matter.
10. Literacy Night – is a option, not previously held.
