1. Approval of Minutes – Motion –Rene Hunter, 2nd Cheryl Simmons
2. Nancy Tingey thanked the SCC for attending the District SCC training and shared treats with us
3. School Community Council Outreach-
 - Website

 - Parent Teacher Conferences- use the January meeting to prep for conferences
4. Presentation from Mary Jo Murray, Achievement Coach re: role of paraeducators
 - Karen, Jan, Nola and a new aide has just been hired to provide more service
 - Children qualify for services with low scores on the CBM testing, Core Phonics Survey, teacher input, and progress monitoring. We follow the Intervention Protocol, variation #1, outlined by the District. Several different kits and manuals are used depending on the grade level being served and the needs of the students. Mary Jo shared progress reports from each individual grade. Nancy Tingey reported the School Board is being asked to approve a new workbook for Pearson Envision Math that will be consumable and reduce the need for copying.
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5. Safe Technology and Digital Citizenship
 - Questions for Naomi Damron, QH Internet Safety Rep- HB 213
 - Canyons started over a year ago with reps from each school to know what strategies are in place to encourage digital citizenship. Handouts were shared during parent-teacher conferences, a bulletin board by the cafeteria, the PTA newsletter, morning announcements, and monthly online safety emails are all being used with students and parents.
 - District Internet Safety Week- February 1-5, 2016
 - Internet safety/citizenship cannot be a “one and done lesson.”

6. Cell Tower Funds – we don't have a cell tower, but funds are shared from schools that do. This year we got \$1653. The SCC has to approve how these funds are spent. Shad proposed the funds be used to provide roving substitutes while teachers observe their peers. Motion to approve: Cheryl Simmons, 2nd Rene Hunter. Motion approved.

7. CSIP & School Land Trust Plan (Goals and Expenditures) – Goals for Quail Hollow are Language Arts 85%, Math 93%. Land Trust funds \$37,772. We hired Tessie Lords to service more students as a paraeducator.
